This email is regarding our attempts to contact The Township of West Lincoln regarding Pride 2020 to both dbylsma@westlincoln.ca and albert.witteveen@niagararegion.ca.

Officials from the Township of West Lincoln have since reached out to Pride Niagara and apologized for the confusion. We understand that there was a miscommunication and the township did not receive the email requests and we appreciate the apology.

I am reaching out today to ask for your support in Pride Niagara's objective of securing funding through the Federal Government's LGBTQ2+ Community Capacity Fund. The Federal Government is interested in partnering with local organizations looking to expand their services in an effort to amplify the needs of LGBTQ2+ individuals within local communities.

We have identified a number of core objectives through this project, including institutionalizing our managerial processes to provide a more sustainable long-term operation for LGBTQ2+ individuals within Niagara, an environmental scan assessing the current status and strengths of other, similar organizations that either work directly or indirectly with LGBTQ2 individuals will be feasible.

Pride Niagara would love to continue building the tradition with each municipality and sincerely hope we can work together and have you in our Rainbow Flag raising tradition.



Mr. Mayor can you please confirm if this is true, and if so, why was this request not forwarded/passed on to staff? Albert, I'm not quite sure why you were added to the email considering you've not really been a part of the flag raising's in the past nor do you have an actual seat at town Council but perhaps in the future could you please forward any such inquiries/emails/requests onto our staff?

Mr. Mayor, I have received multiple inquiries from residents regarding why West Lincoln is the only municipality in all of Niagara that hasn't raised it's Pride flag. As a result, I have also requested to add this matter for discussion at the June 29th Council meeting. I believe our community as well as Pride Niagara deserves an explanation to understand what exactly happened that has prevented our community from taking part in this year's event.

Good morning to all,

It's unfortunate that there's been a fair amount of discussion on this already and there are a couple of things to add to that discussion.

Firstly, and this is a reality for everyone, We live in an age of prolific emails and communications, Truth is I spend several minutes every email session just deleted spam and correspondence from copious sources. This is not an excuse but a reality.

That is why we have a historical municipal protocol that all official requests and correspondence goes through the clerk. That is the fail safe and official receiver of request and information not the mayor or regional councillor. I think that this point has been communicated elsewhere.

Secondly, The fact that both I and Albert received the communication is that the source was generated through the regional hats that we wear. This was confirmed by Previous Mayor who said he never raised a flag locally but did so at the region. Pride Niagara is the organization and the region has and continues to raise the pride flag at the headquarters.

Pride Niagara can make the request to West Lincoln and there is a protocol for the process outlined by the CAO.
